However, the current tense situation in Egypt will make it difficult to achieve these goals in the near future: “There has been political uncertainty and problems in our country for a number of years. This has resulted in high inflation rates and ongoing currency fluctuations. Only a few people can afford their own car at the moment and everyone is saving where they can. This is also reflected in our everyday business”, explains Magdi Tolba, outlining the situation. But he is also optimistic: “The situation has stabilised somewhat over the past year and we hope that it will continue to improve. If the situation in the Middle East calms down a little, there will be a booming aftermarket in Egypt. Then more people will drive cars. So it's also important to focus on the long-term goals: opening more shops. The spare parts dealer also plans to expand the focus beyond the Egyptian market to other countries too.
